The usual 2 minutes silence was observed, which, this year, took place on exactly the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month, 100 years after the end of World War 1.

This month sees the 5 year anniversary of the memorable meeting in the Bridge Inn, when, following an extensive survey of local residents, a packed audience shared the concerns and resultant ideas about the future of the Church. It was proposed that a Friends group should be formed to support the activities of the Church, and to pursue a programme of improvements to its facilities. It was a further 15 months, however, before the actual launch of the Friends and its formal registration as a charity. Nevertheless, fundraising had already started with a programme of events and the launch of our "100 Club", which, in due course, would prove to be a major source of funding. In 2019, we can look back with a great deal of satisfaction on the progress made over the last 5 years, having raised more than £27,000 since 2014. We are immensely grateful for your continued and generous support, not only in your regular attendance at our events, but also for your monthly participation in our "100 Club".

Finally, our next meeting will take place in the Church on **Monday, 11<sup>th</sup> March at 7.30 pm.**

## **Tatham History Society:**

Formed in 2009, the Society mounts annual autumn lectures on the district's history, visits sites of historical interest in the area and runs an annual study day on various topics.
